Lake George Hiking

Prospect Mountain

Distance - 4 miles roundtrip 1650 foot vertical rise Hiking Time - 3 1/2 hours

An easy and convenient trail. See the remains of what was once the world's largest cable railroad. Splendid panoramic views. Stop at three separate overlooks - The Narrows, Lake George and The Eagle's Eye.

Buck Mountain

Distance - 6.6 miles roundtrip 2000 foot vertical rise Hiking Time - 5 hours

Buck Mountain lies on the southeast shore of Lake George, and is a perfect introduction to the Adirondacks. The views from the summit encompass thousands of square miles of the Adirondacks to the north and west, parts of Vermont's Green Mountains to the east, and Lake George and Lake Champlain.

Rogers Rock

Distance - 2 1/2 miles roundtrip Elevation 500 feet Hiking Time - 2 hours

At the outset, the hike is mostly uphill and northerly, and then continues along a seemingly unused path up to a ledge until an open expanse of scenery appears to the west.

Sleeping Beauty, Bumps Pond, and Bumps Pond Overlook

Distance - 4.5 mile loop 1038 Foot vertical rise

The overlook atop the cliffs offers a wide vista. The mountains of Vermont rise beyond the outline of the Champlain Valley to the east.

Five Mile Mountain

Distance: 9 miles round trip Elevation Gain: 2200 ft Hike Time: 5 hours Difficulty: Moderate

Trail Condition: Well maintained trail

HikeType: Out and Back

Highlights: lake views, mountain views

From the parking lot, cross the highway and follow the blue trail. At around 3/4 miles, there is an unmarked intersection. Straight ahead on the yellow trail leads to Deer Leap in under a mile. The blue trail turns left at this intersection and, for the next mile, steadily climbs to the top of Brown mountain. In another mile or so, you reach a lean-to. The summit of Five Mile mountain is less than a mile from this shelter. Just past the true summit, which the trail skirts around, there are view points to the east and west.

Trailhead: Take Interstate 87 North to Exit 24 (next exit after Warrensburg). Turn right onto Bolton Landing-Riverbank Rd. After 4 miles, turn left onto NY Rte 9N heading north. The trailhead is 9.5 miles from here. Parking is on the left side of road.
